Third Conditional

Teacher's Notes

Level: Intermediate

In this Third Conditional activity, students practise the Third Conditional both alone and with a partner.

Aim: To practise the Third Conditional through a variety of written and communicative exercises.

Procedure: Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

Exercise A: Students begin by matching the sentence halves with the correct endings and circling the correct form of the verb.

answer key:

- 1. b, had been
- 2. c, would have been
- 3. a, hadn't saved
- 4. f, had let

- 5. g, wouldn't have missed
- 6. e, had tasted
- 7. d, wouldn't have slipped

5. would have called, hadn't run out

6. had known, would have made

7. would have come, had invited

Exercise B: Next, students complete the sentences, putting the verbs in brackets in the correct form.

answer key:

- 1. had booked, would have saved
- 2. wouldn't have escaped, had closed
- 3. would have walked, had woken up
- 4. had drunk, would have slept

Exercise C: Students then create Third Conditional sentences using the information provided.

answer key:

- 1. If I had brought a map, I wouldn't have got/gotten lost.
- 2. If I hadn't dropped the cup, it wouldn't have broken.
- 3. If it hadn't woken me, I would have overslept.
- 4. If I hadn't been asleep, I would have heard it.
- 5. If I hadn't eaten raw meat, I wouldn't have got/gotten sick.

Exercise D: Students go on to complete the Third Conditional sentences, choosing two verbs and putting them in the correct form.

answer key:

- 1. had paid, wouldn't have gone
- 2. would have won, had practised
- 3. had known, would have baked
- 4. had made, wouldn't have forgotten
- 5. hadn't broken, wouldn't have got/gotten
- 6. wouldn't have been, had gone
- 7. would have been, had used
- 8. wouldn't have woken up, hadn't made
- 9. had watered, wouldn't have died
- 10. wouldn't have got/gotten, had brought

Exercise E: Lastly, students complete the Third Conditional sentences with their own answers, using verbs of their choice. Afterwards, they compare their sentences with their partner and see if any of their endings were similar.
