## **Verbs of Obligation**

## **Teacher's Notes**



Level: Intermediate

In this Verbs of Obligation activity, students practise Verbs of Obligation both alone and with a partner.

Aim: To practise Verbs of Obligation through a variety of written and communicative exercises.

**Procedure:** Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

**Exercise A:** Students begin by matching the sentences with the correct meanings.

answer key:

**Exercise B:** Next, students read the text and mark the correct Verb of Obligation.

answer key:

1. must 2. have to 3. don't have to 4.mustn't

5. should 6. shouldn't 7. must

**Exercise C:** After this, students complete the sentences using the verbs in brackets with the correct Verb of Obligation.

answer key:

1. doesn't have to go 4. have to be / must be

2. should have 5. mustn't take

3. shouldn't eat

**Exercise D:** Students then complete the sentences containing advice/rules for visitors to a restaurant and a museum, using a suitable verb and Verb of Obligation. After this, they decide which sentences apply to which place and write the numbers in the boxes below.
