Teaching Suggestions and Answers

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Activity 1

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1. Put the students into pairs or small groups .
2. Get a student to read the instructions out loud and check that they are clear.
3. Let the students begin their conversation, speaking together in English.
4. Monitor closely.
5. Stop the activity .
6. Do some error correction .
7. Consolidate pronunciation .

Activity 2

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1. If your students don't have access to computers in the classroom, set this for homework.

Answers:

1. Baron de Coubertin started the modern Olympic Games.
2. The Games were stopped by Emperor Theodosius.
3. Athletic events for women were introduced in 1928.
4. They were held in Athens in 1896.
